The concert will be very informal, so our youngest children in the Kindergarten are especially welcome. The opportunity to experience live music-making is not to be missed! It will make a great impression on them!

PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES

Fundamental to the Colourstrings approach is giving children the opportunity to perform very early on in their instrumental life. Giving them this experience so early on (and it

may be simply playing open strings) enables them to share their musicmaking with others and to develop a confidence in their ability to perform in public, so that it becomes a natural thing to do before selfconsciousness becomes an issue. Thev pleased with are SO themselves, and rightly so!

INSTRUMENAL **DEMONSTRATIONS...**

Instrumental demonstrations to the after-school kindergarten children take place in the spring and summer terms each year. This is so that each child who may wish to take up an instrument with us can make an informed decision about which one s/he would prefer.

(It is very important that the child choose the instrument: character of both the child and the instrument need to 'fit' if at all possible.)

The children will be hearing demos on the violin, cello and piano by youngsters who are currently in their 2nd and 3rd year of learning an instrument.

Not all children will be ready to start instrument in September, especially in the 4-5s class. Do have a word with Ingrid if you would like to discuss the matter with her.
